# Sermon Notes and Home Group Guidance Week following 3 April: Matthew 26:1-16 Extravagant Love

Introduction:. This passage records Jesus' anointing at Bethany, an extravagant act of love serving as a powerful illustration of God's extravagant love for us.

# Read Matthew 26:1-16 then answer the following questions:

### To clarify understanding

- a. (v7) "a woman came to him..." Who was this (<u>lohn 12:1-3</u>)?
- b. (v15) Read <u>Exodus 21:32</u>. What does this say of the value that Judas placed on Jesus' life?

# To encourage honest response

- a. How has God spoken to you through this text and sermon? What questions does it raise in your mind?
- b. (v7) "a woman came to him with an alabaster jar of very expensive perfume..."

  What is your own 'alabaster jar of perfume'? Career? Money? Status? Approval?

  When was the last time you sacrificed something valuable to you for the Lord?
- c. (v8) ""Why this waste?" they asked." Do we criticise others sacrificial choices for Jesus? This church project; that church ministry; that person's passion…? When are we most likely to criticise the commitment/devotion of other believers?
- d. (v9) "This perfume could have been sold at a high price and the money given to the poor." (v9); "All a person's ways seem pure to them, but motives are weighed by the Lord.' (Proverbs 16:2) A critical spirit masquerades as righteousness. It's easy to judge others for the way they spend their money, their time, and their talents. Do we hold ourselves to the same standards?
- e. (v13) "...wherever this gospel is preached throughout the world, what she has done will also be told, in memory of her." The fragrance of the perfume lingers on: Mary is remembered for all time for her extravagant love. Judas is remembered for his greed and treachery. What would we most wish to be remembered for?
- f. "Love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all." (Isaac Watts) Around the world, millions of believers face high levels of persecution for following Jesus. Between Oct 2020-Sep 2021, around 6,000 Christians were martyred for their faith. (Source: Open Doors) Many are called literally to give their all for Christ. How does their sacrifice inspire you?

#### **Prayer**

- a. Spend some time in adoration and praise, thanking Jesus for all He did for us.
- b. Pray that we would each display sacrificial extravagance in our use of our wealth, time and talents.
